



WRITING TO YOUR SPONSORED CHILD

- Please write neatly, or type to ease in translation process.
- Feel free to use the stationary provide. Additional copies of the stationary are available on our website under the child sponsorship tab. However, you are welcome to use your own stationary. If you choose to use your own paper, please provide your child's name, as well as your name at the top of the letter so that we can make the right connections.
- Keep your letter simple, and at a level that your child will understand. Some suggested topics are: your family, hobbies, special holidays that you celebrate, and other activities. Also, encourage your child in their education and their relationship with the Lord. For these children, the knowledge that someone from another country loves and cares for them, sees value in them, and encourages their growth will impact them significantly.
- We also suggest writing about things you have in common. Perhaps you have children their age, or you like the same sports or activities as they do. As your child sees that you have things in common with each other, it will help to build their confidence. (Please avoid talking about material possessions which will highlight differences).
- We encourage that you send a picture of you and your family. These photographs will surely be cherished. Please keep in mind that dress code in Haiti is fairly modest. Please be considerate of this when choosing a photograph to send.
- You can also send postcards or pictures of places where you live – such as a snowy mountain, or the beach. However, to protect your family's privacy, please do not include anything specific about your home, or work address in your correspondence.
- Because we hand deliver the letters as teams travel back and forth to Haiti, there will be a time delay from when letters are written to when they are actually received.
- Please do not send communications that are contradictory of the Christian values and philosophy of Ncompass. - Lastly, thank you for taking time to write to your child. However small your relationship may seem at this moment, you are making a direct impact on your child's life– changing them forever. MERCI!
